NOTES

- Competition Start Times: September to April – 6am start, 4pm finish. May to August – 7am start, 4pm finish.
- 2. Eight (8) boats must be logged on by the competition start time to run a competition.
- 3. Competitors must be back at the boat shed and in the queue, ready to be weighed in, at competition finish.
- Competitors must logon and logoff via MAAC Radio or by phone. Competitors who do not log off will be disqualified.
- 5. A nomination form shall be entered, with competitors names, including a \$5 entry fee for each adult, for that wish to fish in the competition.
- 6. Only species and sizes listed on the MAAC Species List will be eligible for weigh-in on MAAC on competition days.

 (with the exception of Game fish and or record
 - (with the exception of Game fish and or record claims).
- Bags containing fish not on the MAAC Species
 List will be disqualified if in doubt ask the FDO
 or an A&S member before entering the boatshed.
- 8. Bags containing undersized fish will be disqualified.
- 9. Fish with the neck broken will have 10mm added to the fish length when measured, after the neck has been pushed back together.

- If a fishers bag has been disqualified, all bags onboard that boat will be disqualified.
- Fish must be brought to the weigh-in in natural fibre bags, no plastic bags, one bag per competitor. The bags should be tagged with the competitors name.
- 12. Fish caught shall be properly cared for; bleed and placed on ice, or in an ice slurry.
- 13. If the Bureau of Meteorology forecasts a 'Strong Wind Warning' for 'Perth Local Waters' the competition will be called off on that day.
- 14. Divers can present a Cray Fish for the weigh in within regulations.
- 15. Anglers <u>cannot</u> present a Cray Fish for the weigh in.
- 16. Anglers are required to carry a release weight when fishing for demersal species
- 17. Anglers are required to hold a fishing licence.
- 18. There are more species included in the seasonal closure than listed on the MAAC Species List.
- 19. Anglers must comply with the relevant fishing rules and regulations published by the Department of Fisheries.
- 20. Plate references are taken from the 'Sea Fishes of Southern Australia' book, unless the plate ref has an Asterix, these are taken from the 'Sea Fishes of Northern Australia' book.
