

NOTES

- Competition Start Times:
Oct to Mar – 6am start, 4pm finish.
Apr to Sep – 7am start, 4pm finish.
- Ten (10) boats must be logged on by the competition start time to run a competition.
- Competitors must be back at the boat shed and in the queue, ready to be weighed in, at competition finish.
- Competitors must logon and logoff via MAAC Radio Room. Competitors who do not log off will be disqualified.
- A nomination form shall be entered, with competitors names, including \$5 for each adult, for all competitors who wish to fish in the competition.
- Only species and sizes listed on the MAAC Species List will be eligible for weigh-in on MAAC on competition days.
(with the exception of Game fish and or record claims).
- Bags containing fish not on the MAAC Species List will be disqualified – if in doubt ask the FDO or an A&S member before entering the boatshed.
- Bags containing undersized fish will be disqualified.
- Fish with the neck broken will have 10mm added to the fish length when measured, after the neck has been pushed back together.
- If a fishers bag has been disqualified, all bags onboard that boat will be disqualified.
- Fish must be brought to the weigh-in in bags, one bag per competitor. The bags should be tagged with the competitor's name.
- Fish caught shall be properly cared for; bleed and placed on ice, or in an ice slurry.
- If the Bureau of Meteorology forecasts a '*Strong Wind Warning*' for '*Perth Local Waters*' the competition will be called off on that day.
- Divers can present a Squid & or Cray Fish for the weigh in within regulations.
- Anglers can present a Squid for the weigh in within regulations.
- Anglers are required to carry a release weight when fishing for demersal species
- Anglers are required to hold a fishing licence.
- There are more species included in the seasonal closure than listed on the MAAC Species List.
- Anglers should familiarise themselves with the relevant fishing rules and regulations published by the Department of Fisheries.
- Plate references are taken from the '*Sea Fishes of Southern Australia*' book, unless the plate ref has an Asterix, these are taken from the '*Sea Fishes of Northern Australia*' book.
